Mark 1:21-34 | The Healing and Deliverance Ministry of Jesus Christ

Mark 1:21-34

- ²¹ They went to Capernaum, and when the Sabbath came, Jesus went into the synagogue and began to teach. ²² The people were amazed at his teaching, because he taught them as one who had authority, not as the teachers of the law. ²³ Just then a man in their synagogue who was possessed by an impure spirit cried out, ²⁴ "What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are the Holy One of God!"
- 25 "Be quiet!" said Jesus sternly. "Come out of him!" 26 The impure spirit shook the man violently and came out of him with a shriek.
- ²⁷ The people were all so amazed that they asked each other, "What is this? A new teaching—and with authority! He even gives orders to impure spirits and they obey him." ²⁸ News about him spread quickly over the whole region of Galilee.
- ²⁹ As soon as they left the synagogue, they went with James and John to the home of Simon and Andrew. ³⁰ Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they immediately told Jesus about her. ³¹ So he went to her, took her hand and helped her up. The fever left her and she began to wait on them.
- ³² That evening after sunset the people brought to Jesus all the sick and demonpossessed. ³³ The whole town gathered at the door, ³⁴ and Jesus healed many who had various diseases. He also drove out many demons, but he would not let the demons speak because they knew who he was.

QUESTIONS

- 1. What were the things Jesus did in the synagogue that caused the people to be amazed? Why were they amazed?
- 2. How did (a) the man with an unclean spirit manifest upon hearing Jesus' teaching; (b) the unclean spirit respond to Jesus' authority; and (c) the people in the synagogue respond on witnessing Jesus' authority?

What did Jesus accomplish through His power ministry?

3.	If you were in a similar situation today, like what Jesus faced in the synagogue, would you do what Jesus did? Why or why not?
4.	In the healing of Peter's mother-in-law, what motivated Jesus to do what He did?
5.	As you reflect on Jesus' healing and deliverance ministry as described in this passage, what is the key takeaway for you?
